The River Valley High School Theatre program successfully presented High School Musical in February last year. Watch for details about attending our 2022 production, Seussical the Musical, coming soon!

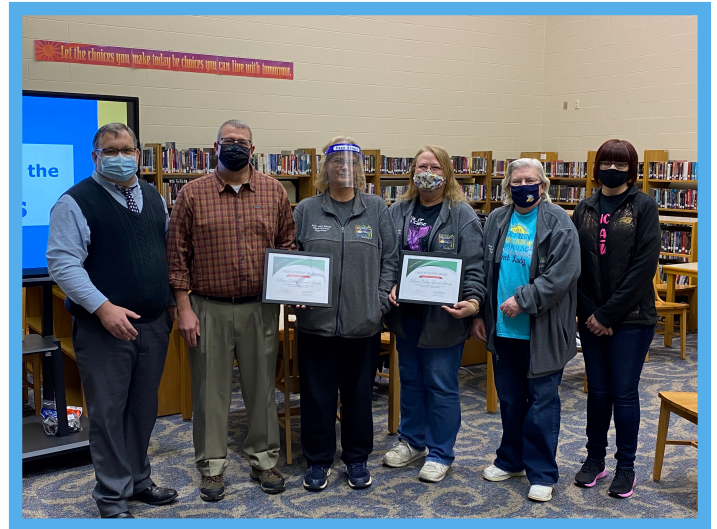


Congratulations to our Food Service Department

At the February Board meeting, RV was awarded the Child Nutrition Award from Children's Hunger Alliance. The award recognized the RV staffs tremendous work to ensure our community received the meals they needed for the 2020-21 school year.

In March 2020, the State of Ohio closed our schools, and our food service department responded with emergency meals and feeding our students. During that time, the River Valley Food Service team was able to serve 207,246 meals and provide over 1,000 produce and family box kits in the RV, Cardington, and Mount Gilead communities.

Due to the quick actions in the ever changing time of COVID-19 relief and our communities positive response, River Valley received a \$15,000 meal grant from "Share our Strength/ No Kid Hungry". With this grant, our food service team was able to increase the breakfast and lunch offerings in the middle and high school buildings as well as increased services through our summer meal program. With the added service, added meal offerings in our cafeterias, and the announcement that all school meals that meet the USDA guidelines will be free for all students through June of 2022, we hope that both school breakfast and lunch will become a more regular part of each and every students' school day.

Treasurer's Talk

River Valley Local School District has been fortunate enough to receive federal funds through COVID relief funds (ESSER, CARES, Broadband) and a Coronavirus Relief sub-grant from Claridon Township. Receiving these funds will allow the District to:

- ➡ Purchase educational technology
- ➡ Provide a continued remote learning option
- ➡ Provide instructional support to students
- ➡ Provide continuity of education and extracurricular activities despite decreased ticket sales and state revenue due to COVID
- ➡ Upgrade the sound and lighting in the High School auditorium and upgrade our libraries/media centers at the Middle School and High School to allow for additional learning lab and educational space in each of these buildings (in progress)

These grant awards will be expended over the next three years. They will allow the District to focus on improving our general fund cash balance while still providing new and exciting opportunities and building improvements within our District that will benefit our students and community.

The River Valley Local School District Board of Education has the most recently approved five-year forecast available for review on the District's website. Five-year forecasts are required to be updated and approved by the Board every November and May.

We greatly appreciate the financial support of our community as we continue to strive toward providing our students the best educational and extracurricular opportunities.

Technology Update 🧐

Our Technology Department has made vast strides in the last twelve months. From moving to a “one Chromebook per student” model to completely replacing our wireless network, we’ve made significant improvements to our equipment and infrastructure to improve education for our students.

Our most recent improvement is adding touchscreen Chromebook devices for all K through 3rd-grade students. Last year we watched students in our lower grades greatly improve their technological literacy but simultaneously lose some of the hand dexterity we need them to have. To address this concern, we leveraged funding sources to purchase touchscreen devices for these younger grades. These tools will allow students and teachers to have more flexibility with technology devices. Therefore, letting students draw, write and annotate on their Chromebook just as they would using traditional paper and pencil. We can’t wait to see how our incredible staff puts these devices to work in creative and fun ways!

Open House

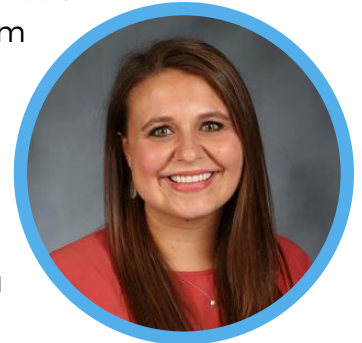

School Counselor - Lareese Marston

For those of you that may not have been aware during the 2020-2021 school year, we were able to hire a full-time school counselor at Heritage Elementary. We were able to make this happen due to a State of Ohio grant for children's social-emotional development. Miss Lareese Marston joined us at the beginning of last school year and has been an incredible asset to our school!

Miss Marston goes into each grade level classroom to complete classroom guidance that focuses on the social-emotional development in children, career readiness and development, and to provide tools to help students with their daily lives. She also works with individual students on an as-needed basis and can recommend further counseling services outside of the school day. Miss Marston has been such a wonderful addition to the Heritage community, and we are thrilled to continue to have her working with our students!



Online Learning Tools & Classroom

Last school year brought us new techniques in teaching, creativity with the use of technology, and protocols that have never been used in education. While it was challenging at times, we have learned a lot about using technology while teaching elementary students. We were excited to be one-to-one with our Chromebooks and are eager to merge the more traditional teaching techniques with technology this school year. We have appreciated the students' and parents' responses to the online learning that has occurred in the past, and while we will still be utilizing Google Classroom, we also look forward to returning to more hands-on learning for the 2021-2022 school year.

Heritage Parking Lot

During a typical school year, we have approximately 150 students that are dropped off and picked up daily. However, the 2020-2021 school year increased this number to approximately 225 students. We averaged 120 vehicles entering the school parking lot within a 15-minute time frame. This provided some congestion both within the parking lot and on Route 98. The safety and well-being of our students and families is always at the forefront of our planning. The River Valley Administration and the Ohio State Highway Patrol worked together to make corrections to the parking lot for the remainder of last school year, which will continue throughout this school year. We look forward to improving traffic flow and ask that everyone dropping off and picking up follow signage and the direction of Heritage Staff.

Thank you to Liberty Elementary student, Emersyn, for donating the profits from her lemonade stand this summer to Liberty's school supplies. Emersyn and her mom dropped off supplies that teachers will be able to give students who are in need.

It's an exciting time for River Valley Athletics as we approach the fall season. Our teams are starting competitions, and there are many important items our community should be aware of.

First, we will begin selling family, student, and adult sports passes on Monday 8/9 in the high school office from 8-3 pm Monday-Friday. Next, at this time there are no restrictions for capacity at indoor and outdoor athletic events. We are looking forward to welcoming everyone back and your support for our student-athletes. 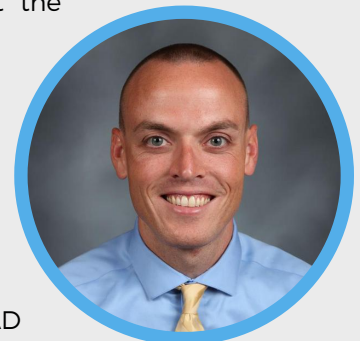
